CEO's Message

What an amazing first year it has been for the Blacktown Venue Management team as we celebrate the achievements of the first year operating as Key Venues.

In our first year, Key Venue's facilities delivered sport, recreation, leisure and fitness outcomes to over 1.5 million visitors across the City's 9 major sport and leisure facilities.

Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney hosted over 15 international teams across a range of events including the World Baseball Classic Qualifiers and the Softball Australia Down Under Series. Other major events included NAB Challenge AFL game between Sydney Swans and Port Adelaide, Blacktown Relay for Life and the International Goalkeepers Academy celebrated 10 years operating at the Sportspark. Joe McAleer Reserve was voted by Cricket NSW as 2nd best facility in the State.

Our Leisure and Aquatic facilities had an exceptional year as well with Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope named Australian Aquatic and Recreation Facility of the Year. Emerton Leisure Centre hosted a NAIDOC Family Fun Day and Blacktown Aquatic Centre continued to be recognised as a state competition venue for elite swimming.

Mount Druitt Swimming Centre celebrating its 40th birthday and its first complete summer season since re-opening in 2014. The Centre also ran a successful 'Dive In' movie series and was acknowledged for its work with the local community in winning the Parks and Leisure Australia NSW/ACT 'Inclusive and Connected Communities' award.

The new Aqua Learn to Swim program has brought consistency in programming to our venues and has proven a great success with over 7,500 students enrolled in the program that is offered across all 5 of our aquatic and leisure facilities.

The first major Key Venues projects were also completed with Blacktown Tennis Centre Stanhope officially opening in August and the completion of Stage 2 of the Blacktown Football Park project. Blacktown Aquatic Centre and Riverstone Swimming Centre are both undergoing some renovations to improve the customer experience for our patrons.

I would like to personally thank the Chairman, Deputy Chairman and Blacktown Venue Management Directors for their guidance over the past 12 months and look forward to the year ahead.

Health and Safety

Blacktown Venue Management Ltd is committed to health and safety.

Our commitment is to the health and safety of our workers, our contractors, our volunteers, our visitors and our customers. It is priority for us.

We have adopted Council's Work Health & Safety Management Plan and systems of operation. We track and measure our performance against key health and safety performance indicators like reducing lost time injuries, workplace inspections, task analysis, risk management, hazard reduction, staff training and audit participation. We welcome and encourage best practice innovation, feedback and comment on what we do and how we do it because that's how we continue to improve.

Each year we invite the Royal Life Saving Society Australia (RLSSA) to independently audit our pools. This year Stanhope, Emerton and Blacktown Aquatic centres scored upwards of 90% and received a 5 Star accreditation from RLSSA – the highest star rating achievable.

We have signed up for the Royal Life Saving's 'Keep Watch @ Public Pools' initiative. This initiative tells parents how they can help us by supervising their children in the pool environment.

Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope remains the only aquatic centre in Australia using technology to help increase aquatic safety supervision with the Poseidon Drowning Detection system. Blacktown's commitment to community safety resulted in our being invited to present to an international audience at the World Conference on Drowning Prevention (WCDDP) in Penang, Malaysia. What an honour.

William (Bill) McNamara OAM has served on the Blacktown Venue Management Ltd board for the past 14 years. Bill was inducted into the Blacktown Hall of Fame in 2015.

Bill grew up in Riverstone and undertook a carpentry apprenticeship with Riverstone Meatworks before branching out and creating McNamara Constructions.

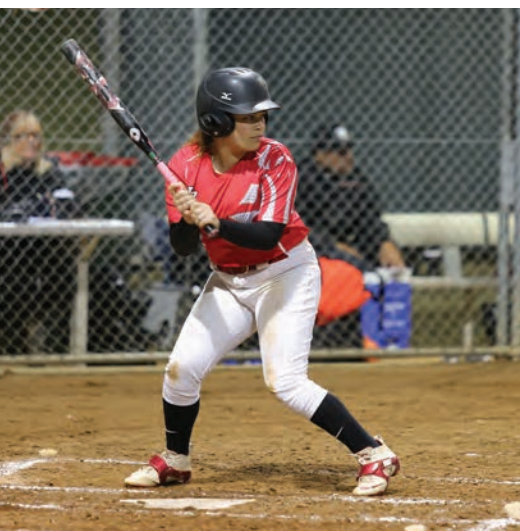

Blacktown Aquatic Centre has enjoyed another successful year with 274,218 visitors enjoying the facilities, program and events offered at the Centre.

The Centre's 50 metre competition pools have once again proved popular for school and regional swimming carnivals with the Centre hosting 44 carnivals including 7 zone & regional and 2 state carnivals.

Blacktown City Swim Club is based at Blacktown Aquatic Centre holding all training and club competition at the venue.

The aquatic facilities are also utilised by a variety of sporting groups including Blacktown RSL Youth Swimming Club, Seven Hills- Toongabbie RSL Swimming Club and Youth Swim Club, Blacktown City Masters and Special Olympics.

Water safety and education is a key element of the Centre's aquatic programming with the Council run Aqua Learn to Swim program reaching over 2,000 participants during Term 1 2016. All swim school participants are encouraged to take part in safety week to learn swim and survival skills in a fun and safe environment.

The Department of Education conduct their school swimming scheme at the venue with over 20 schools taking part in the scheme. Primary and secondary schools also utilise the Centre for recreational sport, fitness and programs throughout the year.

Blacktown Aquatic Centre's health and fitness facilities include a cardio studio and weights room in addition to the 33 group fitness classes offered each week. These classes include boxing and aqua aerobics.

The Centre also offers targeted health and fitness programs including the highly successful Young at Heart program aimed at keeping those in the over 50 age group active and social.

Through grant funding Blacktown Aquatic Centre delivered a comprehensive Seniors Week Program in 2016 that included free group fitness and a Grey Medallion program focused on water safety and resuscitation skills.

Blacktown Aquatic Centre school holiday programs 'Kids Kaper' run every school holiday period and feature activities such as visits from Emergency Services, fitness classes, sports skills and aquatic activities.

Blacktown Aquatic Centre was recognised by their customers and the community by being named as a finalist in the 2016 Blacktown Local Business Awards for Fitness Services.

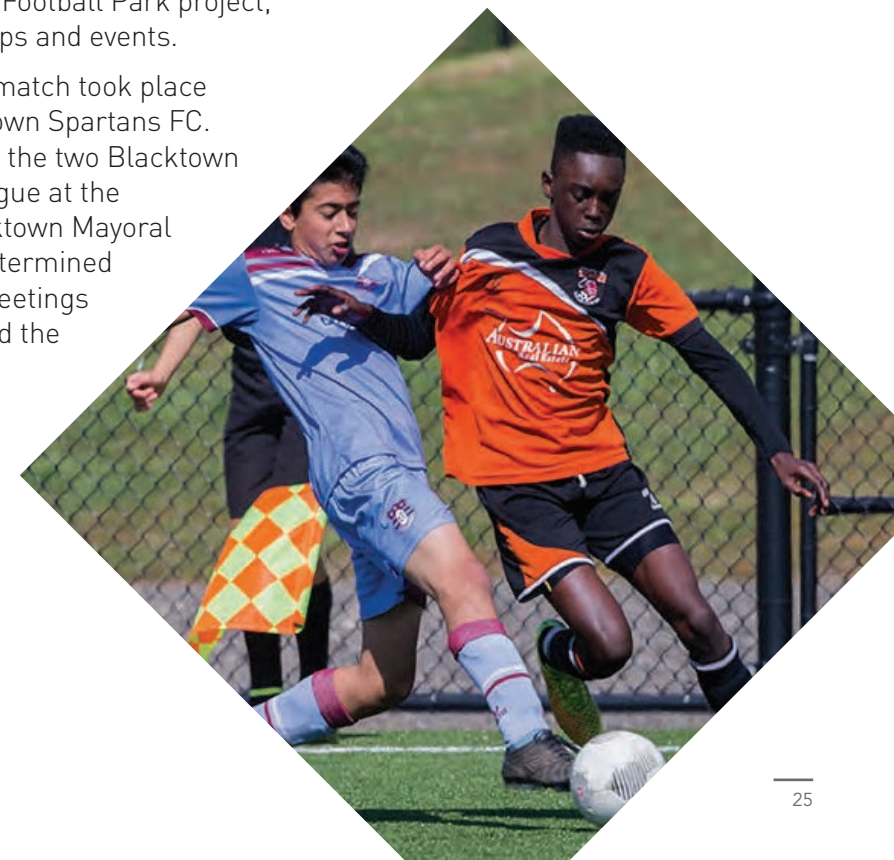
Home to Blacktown District Soccer Football Association (BDSFA), Blacktown Football Park hosted over 854 events which included a variety of football competitions, training sessions and camps.

BDSFA owns the NSW Premier League team, the Blacktown Spartans. The Spartans utilise Blacktown Football Park for all home games and training field teams in the Men and Women's premier league and Football NSW competition along with juniors from 9 years of age.

The Association has 23 affiliated clubs and hosts the finals for all competitive age groups in September each year at the venue which boasts a Synthetic Soccer field and 2 turf fields.

Anne Aquilina Reserve now provides 3 turf fields due to the completion of Stage 2 of the Blacktown Football Park project, and is used for a variety of training camps and events.

The inaugural Blacktown Mayoral Cup match took place between Blacktown City FC and Blacktown Spartans FC. The Blacktown Mayoral Cup recognises the two Blacktown Clubs who play in the NSW premier league at the highest level in state football. The Blacktown Mayoral Cup is held annually with the winner determined by the aggregate scores over the two meetings each season. Blacktown City FC claimed the 2015 Blacktown Mayoral Cup.

Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney hosted 5107 events, attended by 586,607 athletes, spectators and officials during the 2015/16 period.

The Olympic legacy venues of athletics, baseball and softball have been complemented by the addition of AFL, cricket, football and goalkeeping to truly make the Sportspark the home of sport in Western Sydney.

Western Sydney Wanderers Football Club

Football at the Sportspark continues to grow with the Western Sydney Wanderers FC training and administration headquarters based at the Sportspark. Plans for the club's permanent training and administration headquarters are well underway as the club enters into its 5th season in the Hyundai A-League Competition. The Wanderers Youth League and Women's League teams also utilise the Sportspark for training along with hundreds of youngsters who attend their school holiday training clinics each year.



International Goalkeepers Academy

The International Goalkeepers Academy has celebrated its 10th year of operation at Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney.

The Academy, led by former Australia Goalkeeper and Hall of Fame inductee Jim Fraser, caters for goalkeepers and strikers of all ages and skill levels.

Several goalkeepers from the academy have enjoyed success in high level competitions such as the Hyundai A-League and European leagues including Jordan Holmes who is playing with Bournemouth FC in English premier League.

Baseball

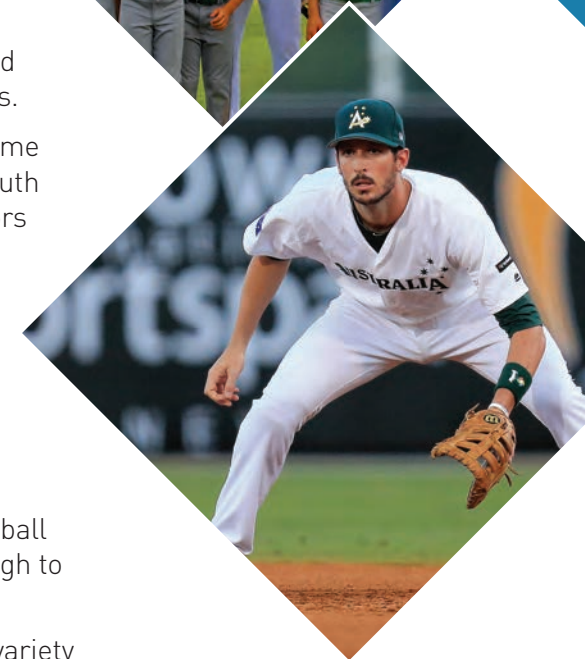
Home to the Sydney Blue Sox, and Baseball NSW, Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney's Baseball Centre has continued to be at the heart of baseball in Australia since its development as a playing and training venue for the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games. The Baseball Centre returned to the world stage this year, as Baseball is set to return to the 2020 Olympics.

The World Baseball Classic Qualifiers was hosted for the first time in Australia. The competition saw Philippines, New Zealand, South Africa and Australia compete to qualify with over 8,000 spectators visiting the Sportspark across the 4 day tournament. Australia claimed victory and will go on to compete in the 2017 World Baseball Classic in Japan.

Korean Baseball League team, the Doosan Bears added to the international flavour at the ballpark holding their annual spring pre season training camp at the Baseball Centre.

The Sydney Blue Sox had an impressive 2015/16 season playing all home games and conducting all training at the Baseball Centre for the fifth consecutive year from November 2015 through to January 2016.

As home to Baseball NSW, the Sportspark continues to host a variety of state and regional competitions each year. The U18 Championships saw Country NSW claim the national title for the first time.



Softball

Olympic Legacy continues as Softball gears up for their return to the Olympics in 2020. The Softball Centre hosted over 691 events, training and competitions over the year, including 15 international teams from Japan, New Zealand, United States of America and Indonesia.

The Centre hosted 4 National Championships, and over 130mm of rain didn't dampen the spirits of those competing in the Gilleys Shield Open and Esther Deason under 17 Women's National Softball Championships in January.

The Japanese Red Terriers returned for their summer training Camp, and the Japanese National Squad had a training camp and series against Australia in preparation for the World Championships.

The Centre also hosted the International Friendship Series, 2016 Inaugural Australia Cup, the 10th Blacktown Junior International Challenge Celebrations and 2016 Down Under International Series along with the NSW State League and school based competitions.



AFL

Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney hosts a variety of International, National, State and Regional AFL events each year.

The 2016 NAB Challenge saw the Sydney Swans claim victory over Port Adelaide Power, backed up by the GWS Giants Annual Fan Day at the Sportspark which saw 800 fans come out for the presentation of team Guernseys – the largest in Club History!

The Sportspark hosted several NEAFL matches, the U18's National Championships and saw two new clubs, the newly rebranded Western Magic and newly created Blacktown Suns claim the venue as their home ground. 2016 also saw the launch of the Western Sydney Youth Girls for ages 11-15.

GWS Academy is based at the Sportspark's AFL/Cricket Centre providing a development pathway for the stars of the future. This year was the first time a female development was launched.

School based competitions and programs see thousands of students converge on the high quality AFL facilities to take part in competitions such as the Intensive English Centre's Cup, GIANTS Cup, Paul Kelly Cup and PSSA State Championship.



Athletics

Blacktown International Sportspark's Athletics Centre is one of Western Sydney's most popular athletics venues with over 152,194 competitors and spectators utilising the venue for athletics carnivals, training and community events.

Olympian Jana Pittman and hopeful Josh Clarke utilised the venues high quality facilities for their 2016 Rio Olympic Games training.

The Westlink M7 Blacktown Running Festival ran for the second time, an initiative that sees competitors take part in a variety of long running events including the Marathon, half marathon, 10km and 4km runs and 10km and 4km walks.



Cricket

Home of cricket in Western Sydney, Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney's cricket facilities have hosted a diverse range of programs and competitions during the 2015/16 season.

The Sportspark hosted 4 National Matador Cup Games and even a world record broken for the highest partnership during the Australia XI and New Zealand warm up games by opening batsmen Aaron Finch and Ryan Carters recorded an impressive 503 run partnership that will go down in the history books as the highest ever Australian opening partnership.

Women's cricket was again a highlight with the Sportspark again hosting Women's National Cricket League matches and for the first time Women's Big Bash League games.

Sydney Thunder were crowned champions of both the Men and Women's Big Bash League, with both teams training at the venue throughout the season.

Cricket NSW's local and regional school programs have seen hundreds of students take part in gala days and skills sessions at the Sportspark across the 2015/16 period.



Community Events

Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney hosted the annual Blacktown Relay for Life at the Athletics Centre. The event is a 24 hour fund raiser for the Cancer Council to assist with education, support and advocacy services.

During January, the community enjoyed Waterworld Central's inflatable waterpark with over 9,000 residents taking a splash.

Other community events have included community gala days and carnivals at the Athletics Centre.

Welcoming over 11.7 million visitors since opening in 2013, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope was named the AH Pierce Facility of the Year by the Aquatics and Recreation Institute in 2016. This is the second time the Centre has been recognised for its high quality facilities, programs and experiences.

In the past 12 months Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope provided sport, leisure and fitness opportunities for over 550,849 residents.

The Aqua Learn to Swim program, launched in 2015 attracts an average of 4,000 participants each terms with numbers reaching 4,345 in Term 1 2016.

Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope offers 53 group fitness classes weekly ranging from Les Mills Body Pump, Body Combat, Zumba and Young at Heart in addition to Spin classes and Aqua Aerobics totaling over 2,700 classes for the period.

The health and fitness studio complements these classes.

Primary and Secondary schools utilise the aquatic, health and fitness and stadium facilities for recreational sport, competition and programs each year. The 2 court stadium facilities were closed from late

2015 in order for the addition of 2 new courts which will be suitable for basketball, netball, badminton, volleyball and futsal. The completed 4 court stadium opened in August 2016.

Community and sporting groups are regular hirers of Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope's multi purpose spaces and meeting rooms space. These groups include dance schools, football skills clinics, martial arts clubs, sporting teams and church groups. The Western Sydney Wanderers FC A-League squad regularly use the gym and aquatic facilities as part of their recovery sessions.

The Kidz Blitz school holiday program provides fun activities for youngsters aged 5-12 years during the school holiday period. Activities include sports clinics, fitness classes, aquatic activities, cooking classes. The Centre also hosted a variety of school holiday shows which were open for the public to attend including a science show and interactive reptile display.

Emerton Leisure Centre welcomed 141,338 visitors who took part in a variety of programs, events and leisure activities.

The aquatics facilities hosted 22 school carnivals from February to March including 1 zone carnival.

Aqua Learn to Swim program delivered over 948 lessons with the Centre's enrolments reaching a milestone of 1,000 students in Term 1 2016. The Department of Education's School Swimming Scheme use the venues with 23 schools taking part in the opportunity to learn important water safety skills.

The Centre is home to Emerton Swim Club who offer the opportunity to compete at regular club nights and competitions.

The stadium hosts competitions and programs including Little Kickers Blacktown & Districts, Midnight Basketball, Charity Bounce, Blacktown City Netball, karate, indoor hockey and dancing. Local primary and secondary school have used the facility as part of their physical development program for sports such as netball, basketball, indoor soccer and group fitness.

Emerton Leisure Centre offers aquatic and land based group fitness classes including yoga, boxing and aqua aerobics. There are 17 classes available each week with 800 classes run during the 2015/16 period.

Engaging with the community is a key part of Emerton Leisure Centre's programs. The centre hosts the successful Midnight Basketball program that targets disadvantaged youth. It attracts over 80 youth and 20 volunteers each tournament.

Breaking Barriers fitness program targets at risk Indigenous youth that are known to the Police or Justice system with over 20 youth taking part in the program each term. Participants are taught the importance of a healthy lifestyle through group fitness classes and mentoring sessions.

The annual NAIDOC Week celebrations are a regular event on the Centre's calendar. Through an ongoing relationship with Koori Radio the event provides an opportunity for the community to experience and learn more about indigenous culture.

Joe McAleer Reserve is located in Glendenning and is Blacktown City's only exclusive cricket facility.

The facility is home of Blacktown City and Districts Cricket Association and Sydney First Grade club Blacktown Warriors. Joe McAleer was awarded 2nd place in the Sydney Grade Cricket ground of the year competition by Cricket NSW.

The Blacktown Warriors conduct all training, trials and home games at the venue with Joe McAleer Oval hosting 165 events in 2015/16.

In total the venue saw over 21,194 players, coaches and spectators through the facility in 2015/16. Blacktown City and Districts Cricket Association also hosted trials and development opportunities for their junior players. Joe McAleer this year also hosted Cricket NSW Academy fixtures.

In the 2015/16 Sydney Grade Cricket season, Blacktown first grade improved their position from 16th to 12th in the two day competition. They also finished in the 3rd in the limited overs fixtures.

Significant work has been undertaken to improve the quality of the playing surface and practice wickets. A renovation and maintenance program for wicket tables and outfield, including herbicide applications to minimise weed, regular fertilising across the facility, and wicket table maintenance have achieved great results and feedback from players and officials.

Mount Druitt Swimming Centre is a seasonal pool that is open from September to March each year.

The 2015/16 season saw 41,033 visitors enjoy the facilities for a variety of programs, carnivals and community events. The aim for the 2015/16 season was to re-engage, connect and establish relevance for a seasonal swimming Centre.

The Centre celebrated its 40th year of operation this year with a free community event and a slogan "your community – your pool". The Community fun day saw over 1500 patrons enjoy a range of free community activities.

This was truly embraced by the community and Mount Druitt Swimming Centre won the NSW/ACT Parks and Leisure Australia Award for Inclusive and Connected Communities. The Centre was also a finalist in the Aquatic and Recreation Institute's AH Pierce Memorial Aquatic Facility of the year.

Home to Rooty Hill RSL Youth Swim club for training and competition, Mount Druitt Swimming Centre is a popular venue for school swimming carnivals. The Centre hosted 18 primary and secondary School carnivals from December to March and 4 Zone and Regional carnivals. 8 Schools used the centre for their Learn to Swim program.

The Centre also hosted the Inaugural Blacktown Councils Pools Swim Club Challenge, and was selected to host the RSL 55th Annual Youth Club State Swimming Championships in March which attracted over 1,200 participants from 28 RSL Swim Clubs from as far as Dubbo, Muswellbrook and Gosford.

The Centre hosted a three part Dive-In Movies series across three weekends in January. Regular health and fitness programs Aqua Aerobics & Aqua Zumba were held weekly during the season along with the Council run Aqua Learn to Swim program which ran for the full season.

The 2015/16 season ended in April 2016 with a family fun day with the Centre reopening for the 2016/17 summer season in September 2016.

Riverstone Swimming Centre is a seasonal swimming pool that operates from September to March each year. The Centre saw over 49,467 visitors enjoy the pool facilities for carnivals, swimming club and leisure during 2015/16 season.

The Swimming Centre is home to the Riverstone Dolphins Swim Club who utilise the pool for training and competition. The Club is one of the largest youth clubs in the region and facilitates opportunity for the community to participate in swimming for fun and leisure.

Primary and secondary school carnivals are a regular hire from January to March each year with the Centre hosting 18 primary, secondary and special needs carnivals during the 2015/16 season.

Blacktown City Council's successful Aqua Learn to Swim program has been very successful operating during Terms 1 & 4. The Department of Education School Swimming Scheme also uses Riverstone Swimming Centre each year for their School Swimming Scheme engaging 18 local school to take part in the program.

A Sunday Funday Free Family Fun Day marked the end of the 2015/16 season with the community taking part in a range of activities including Aqua Zumba and clinics by Little Kickers Blacktown & Districts.



Future Projects

Key venues is committed to developing and enhancing the sport, leisure and recreation opportunities available not only for the City but the Greater Western Sydney region.

The first 2 projects to be completed are Blacktown Tennis Centre and Stage 2 of Blacktown Football Park.

Blacktown Tennis Centre Stanhope opened in August 2016 featuring 16 plexi-cushion tennis courts - including 4 championship size courts and an exhibition court - making it the largest tennis centre of its kind in the State.

Stage 2 of Blacktown Football Park was completed in September increasing the fields to 4 at Anne Aquilina Reserve from 3 to 4. These will be highly utilised by Blacktown District Soccer Football Association. Stage 3 development will include a permanent training and administration base for the Western Sydney Wanderers FC.

Upgrades to Blacktown Aquatic Centre and Riverstone Swimming Centre are well underway to improve the customer experience and leisure opportunities available to the community.

Development of an International Centre for Training Excellence at Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney is also in the planning stages along with a revised Masterplan for the venue.



Aqua Learn to Swim

Aqua Learn to Swim operates across all 5 Key Venues Aquatic and Leisure facilities (Blacktown Aquatic Centre, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope, Emerton Leisure Centre, Mount Druitt Swimming Centre and Riverstone Swimming Centre). This program was launched in October 2015.

Aqua Learn to Swim provides a safe, rewarding, fun and educational experience for all participants. The program offers various program levels for infants, preschoolers and school aged children. Classes for adults, teenagers and those with special needs are also available.

Aqua Learn to Swim is a term program that not only teaches children how to swim, but also encourages progression through the program with assessments which are conducted each term.

Aqua Learn to Swim has become a strong brand and it supports the local community through specialised programs and presence at community events. The program mascot, Pip the penguin and the Aqua Learn to Swim Team has participated in several community events including Blacktown City Festival and Australia Day.

There has been significant growth in the number of students enrolled in the program particularly at Emerton Leisure Centre and Blacktown Aquatic Centre with these venues celebrating milestone statistics of 1,000 and 2,000 students respectively. These statistics are the highest ever number of students recorded for each Centre.

In Term 3 2016 Aqua Learn to Swim commenced a pilot program with Ngallu Wal Aboriginal Children and Family Services that provides a group of indigenous youth the opportunity to partake in swimming lessons as a group, in conjunction with the group we also provide a meal prior to the lesson.

Aqua Learn to Swim continues to play an important role in spreading the message about water safety and learning to swim. The Aqua Learn to Swim team, along with Pip The Penguin have visited several Blacktown City Council Kids Early Learning Centres to provide a water safety talk to the students.
