Joe McAleer Oval, and curator Kieran Meurant won Cricket NSW best facility in the State. The Sportspark hosted home games for both the inaugural AFL Women's Competition GWS Giants and the T20 Women's Sydney Thunder.

Softball NSW celebrated 70 years and hosted the 70th Gilley's Shield Open Women's Softball Competition.

Key Venues' facilities delivered sport, recreation, leisure and fitness outcomes to over 1 million visitors across the City's 10 major sport and leisure facilities. Both our facilities and team received several accolades throughout the year.

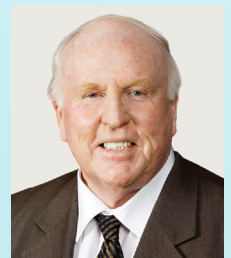

BLACKTOWN KEY VENUES

Following a Council restructure in December 2014 Blacktown Venue Management Ltd assumed oversight of Blacktown City Council aquatic and leisure centres, 1 oval and 16 Tennis Courts in addition to managing Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney.

Key Venues brings together 10 of Blacktown City's premier sport and leisure facilities.

The venues themselves are diverse ranging from Council's flagship sports facility Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney to the award winning leisure and aquatic centres in Blacktown Aquatic Centre, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope and Emerton Leisure Centre. Rounding up the aquatics facilities are the City's 2 seasonal swimming pools, Mount Druitt and Riverstone. Blacktown Tennis Centre Stanhope also completed its first year of operation.

Blacktown's first grade cricket and premier league football teams utilise the facilities of Joe McAleer Oval and Blacktown Football Park along with Anne Aquilina Reserve which is a hub for a variety of grassroots and school sporting activities.

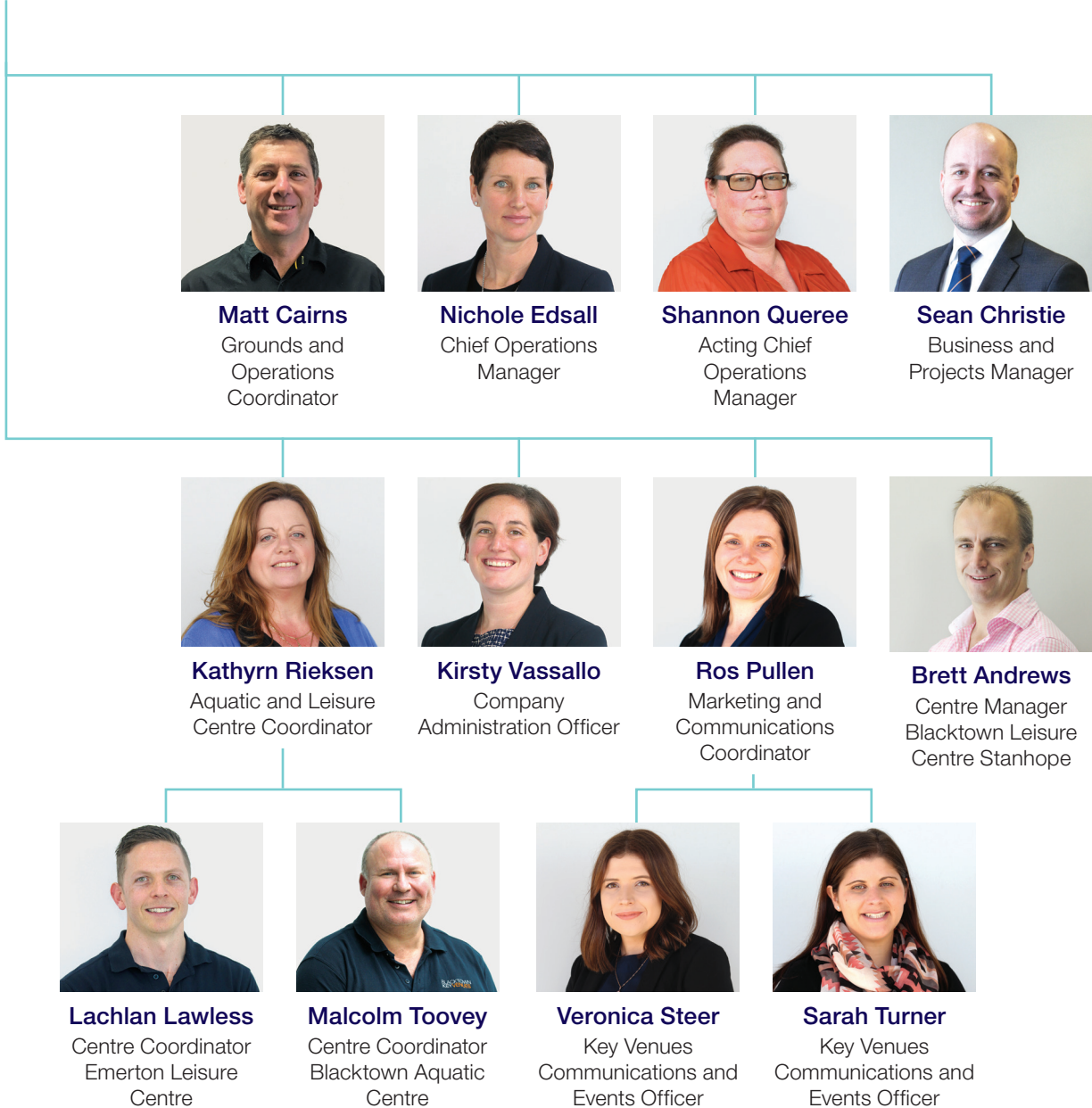

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Blacktown Venue Management Ltd is committed to Work Health and Safety (WHS) and follows Blacktown City Council's Work Health and Safety Policy (POL 100) as best practice.

This policy recognises due diligence must apply in managing work health and safety by providing a safe and healthy workplace for all workers and other persons.

Blacktown Venue Management Ltd in-line with Council policy is committed to:

- Reducing the frequency of lost time incidents
- Ensuring compliance with legislative requirements and current industry standards relating to WHS
- Providing and maintaining safe structures, fixtures, fitting, plant, substances, systems of work, healthy work environment, adequate welfare facilities and access to those facilities
- Providing for safe use, handling and storage of plant, structures and substances
- Providing and maintaining written procedures and instructions

- Providing health and safety information, instruction, training and supervision to workers, contractors/sub-contractors and their workers, volunteers and other persons
- Consulting with workers, contractors, sub-contractors, volunteers, labour hire workers and others persons on work health and safety issues and performance
- Providing support and resources to managers and workers to help them fulfil their legal work health and safety duties
- Disseminating information to all workers, contractors and their workers, sub-contractors and their workers, labour hire workers, volunteers and other persons
- Ensuring hazards in the work environment are identified, assessed and controlled
- Monitoring the health of workers and the conditions at the workplace to prevent illness or injury of workers
- Providing Injury Management

In addition to WHS policy, all Key Venues leisure and aquatic facilities work closely with Royal Life Saving

Australia and operate within the Guidelines for Safe Pool operation.

Blacktown Aquatic Centre, Emerton Leisure Centre and Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope, Mount Druitt Pool and Riverstone Swimming Centre have all received a 5 Star Water Safety Partner accreditation from Royal Life Saving demonstrating the facilities' commitment to aquatic safety standards. This is a result of independent audit that reviews procedures and facility features.

Our ongoing commitment to water safety and education is further demonstrated through the promotion of Royal Life Saving's 'Keep Watch @ Public Pools' initiative. This initiative has key messages for parents on how they need to supervise their children in an aquatic environment and tips for lifeguards on how to assist with supervision.

Emerton Leisure Centre received a score of 97.75% in the Safe Work NSW Audit – the highest ever result by Blacktown City Council.

Blacktown Venue Management successfully rolled out defibrillators across all its sporting facilities within Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney in 2017.



VALE EMERITUS MAYOR CHARLIE LOWLES OAM

Emeritus Mayor Charlie Lowles OAM passed on 30 October 2016.

Councillor Lowles served as a Councillor for 27 years and was Mayor 6 times during that period. He was chairman of the Blacktown Venue Management Ltd board between 2009 and 2011.

The status of Emeritus Mayor was awarded in 2005, and in 2013 he received the Medal of the Order of Australia for his service to local government and the community.

He strongly supported a range of community projects including Mount Druitt Pool, Popendetta Park and was instrumental in the redevelopment of Emerton Leisure Centre.

During his time on the board of Blacktown Venue Management, Councillor Lowles was involved with significant developments including:

- Development of the AFL/Cricket Centre which opened in 2009
- Master planning to ensure the sustainability of the Sportsark

In recognition of his service to the community, Blacktown City Council moved that Emerton Leisure Centre should be renamed to the Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton later in 2017.



VALE COUNCILLOR LEO KELLY OAM

Councillor Leo Kelly OAM passed on 23 January 2017, Councillor Kelly was Mayor of Blacktown City 3 times and served for 15 years on the Local Government Association of NSW.

He served as chairman of the Blacktown Venue Management Ltd board between 2004 and 2009 offering guidance and support to the staff during a time of significant change.

He was instrumental in the establishment of Nurragingy Reserve and the opening of Blacktown Arts Centre. He was awarded the Medal for the Order of Australia in 2003 recognising his contribution to local government.

During his time on the board of Blacktown Venue Management, significant developments included:

- Athletics grandstand development at the Athletics Centre in 2006
- Planning and negotiation with the State Government, AFL and Cricket to secure funding for the AFL/Cricket Centre

In recognition of his service to the community, Blacktown City Council moved that Blacktown Arts Centre be renamed to Leo Kelly Arts Centre Blacktown.

The NSW Premier League, Blacktown Spartans are owned by the Blacktown District Soccer Football Association (BDSFA) and enjoy all the advantages that Blacktown Football Park offer. Benefits that filter through to every member of the association. And thanks to BDSFA's ongoing commitment to the game and talent development, more and more opportunities are being offered to participate and grow in this dynamic and popular sport.

Growing the sport has a lot to do with establishing strong foundations. With outstanding amenities for all home games, and training, the Association has been building for the future with:

- 23 affiliated clubs across all competitive age groups
- Spartans youth boys and girls
- Association Youth League teams for 13 to 16 year old boys
- Spartans National Premier League men and National Premier League women's teams, inspiring younger players

Additional programs have kept the kids **on course for excellence** thanks to:

- Spartans' skills acquisition programs for girls and boys, 9 years and older
- Academy programs for 7 to 11 year old boys and girls
- The monthly *Big Sister Little Sister* program launched in May which saw the Spartans 1st Grade women mentoring local Association girls
- Coach the Coaches courses by Spartans SAP Technical Director to help ensure players and those guiding them are developing

- Association finals football played out across 7 curated pitches (1 synthetic and 6 turf) post the completion of stage 2 development at Anne Aquilina Reserve

WELL PLAYED JACK TAYLOR

Blacktown legend's legacy

Jack Taylor devoted 38 years of his life to the service of Blacktown District Soccer Football Association as Secretary (1987), Executive Director (2007) and finally CEO of one of Australia's premier sports organisations. He hung up his boots this past year after helping BDSFA achieve so much for the wider community.

From playing for Bidwill Soccer Club in 1979 to literally changing the local landscape upon which this great game is played. Jack was the driving force behind securing a vital \$5 million in State Government funds, working with Council and putting valuable contributions from the district's players to work on his vision. That vision was what is now widely recognised as a top tier football venue – Blacktown Football Park.

While that may be recognised as a crowning achievement, Jack's tenure contributed to the extraordinary growth of the Association. BDSFA swooped upon the unprecedented enthusiasm and interest in the sport, swelling player numbers to 10,000 across 23 clubs. With Jack at the helm, BDSFA:

- Led the way in governance, participation and safety
- Put children first, instilling a child safety culture through NSW Working With Children compliance
- Equipped their venues with defibrillators
- Championed female participation
- Instituted the NSW government's model constitution and versions thereof among clubs

A life member of BDSFA since 1997, a recipient of both the Football NSW State award and Mayoral Shield, Jack is a shining example of service to one's community.

KICKING GOALS FOR DIVERSITY

Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney hosts Aussie Rules

Blacktown City boasts 177 nationalities speaking 169 languages and a passion for AFL. It's little wonder then, that Sportspark was selected as the venue for several national, international and local events where diversity stood out from the crowd. From grassroots talents through to seasoned professionals, AFL players came together in an environment fostering cultural enrichment, athletic development and a genuine love of the game.

This past year, thousands of spectators have been treated to an array of AFL talent on display at Sportspark including:

- AFL NAB Women's GWS Giants Home Games
 - Sportspark is now home to the GWS Giants and 4000 spectators turned out for their 2017 home opener against Fremantle, battling to a thrilling draw. With the popularity of women's AFL soaring, the sport makes for a wonderful family day out
 - Thrilling games at Sportspark will be the norm for years to come. The best junior female footballers gave it their all at the NAB AFL Women's Under 18s Championship in May. All hoping to catch the eye of coaches and recruiters, crowds were treated to fierce competition for the championship and a place in 2018's expanded 8-team league
- JLT Community Series – Sydney Swans v GWS Giants
 - A tightly contested derby saw the Sydney Swans squeak past the GWS Giants in March – and the rivalry continues!
- AFL Diversity Championships
 - Now in its 4th year, the championships were held for the first time in Blacktown. The event saw 300 players from across Australia come together, in April, under the joint banners of multiculturalism and Australian rules football
 - Upon the traditional lands of the Darug people, respect, skill and healthy competition was celebrated at Sportspark
 - All participants from coaches and umpires through to doctors and trainers contributed to an elite AFL program environment at facilities second to none
- AFL Intensive English Cup
 - Students from 14 Intensive English Centres (IEC) across Sydney and Wollongong descended on Blacktown for the 6th annual gala event held this past July
 - Many languages, so many cultures, one competition, all part of the AFL's engagement programs embracing migrants and refugees
- Sydney AFL season including the Final Series and the Grand Final
- Home to Western Magic and Blacktown Suns
- North Eastern AFL Competition games and finals

Home runs at baseball

Diamonds are for everyone or so it would seem as baseball players from the local scene to interstate powerhouses to International heavy-hitters took to Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney's Baseball Centre. As a former Olympic competition and training site, the Centre's three dedicated diamonds and grandstand facilities, once again, proved the perfect:

- Home
 - The Sydney Blue Sox based their 2016/17 Australian Baseball League campaign here, playing all home games and practicing at the Baseball Centre
 - Baseball NSW's preferred venue for a variety of competitions and championship play
- Host
 - The reigning champions of the vaunted Korean Baseball League, the Doosan Bears, returned to the Sportspark for their spring preseason training camp
 - Baseball NSW state and regional championships were contested at the Sportspark throughout the season
 - 2017 Junior and Senior Baseball State Championships featured 17 teams last April

- Winners' circle
 - Hills Little League won the Australian Little League Championships and represented Australia for the 2nd year in a row at the Little League World Series
 - Greater Western Baseball Association won their way to the Senior League nationals for the first time (BISP's local Association)
 - Cronulla represented NSW and then Australia in the Junior League World Series in Taylor, Michigan, USA
 - Australian National Junior Championships featured two teams from NSW
 - Team Australia took three Blue Sox players to the World Baseball Classic

The Baseball Centre will, once again, prepare players for the world stage as the sport returns to the 2020 Olympics in Japan, cementing Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney as a destination for excellence.





CRICKET

From pathways to elite

Recognised internationally for the pristine condition of the grounds and pitches, Sportspark once again attracted all manner of enthusiasts and participants in all forms of the game. This season at Blacktown International Sportspark Sydney saw:

- International guests
 - New Zealand's Canterbury cricket team selected the Sportspark as the preferred venue for its training and exhibition match against Cricket NSW 2nd XI
 - Bangladesh Coach, Chandika Hathurusingha led preparations for his nation's Test Series against New Zealand at the Sportspark facilities citing, **"the first-class facilities and excellent team of greenkeepers"**
 - Teams from Papua New Guinea, Pakistan and Hong Kong also got the most from the facilities in their pursuit of international acclaim
- The continuing evolution of Women's cricket
 - Sydney Thunder of the Women's Big Bash League played all their home fixtures at the Sportspark
 - Women's National Cricket League matches continued growing in stature at this popular venue
- Grassroots development for the love of the game
