Blacktown Venue Management Ltd is committed to work health and safety (WHS) and follows Blacktown City Council's work health and safety Policy (POL 100) as best practice. This policy recognises due diligence must apply in managing work health and safety by providing a safe and healthy workplace for all workers and other persons.

In addition to the policy, all Key Venues' leisure and aquatic facilities work closely with Royal Life Saving Society Australia and operate within the Guidelines for Safe Pool operations.

Our ongoing commitment to water safety and education is further demonstrated through the promotion of Royal Life Saving's 'Keep Watch @ Public Pools' initiative. This initiative has key messages for parents on how they need to supervise their children in an aquatic environment.

Staff are required to attend regular training to ensure they are meeting the highest possible safety standards when working within the centre. Royal Life Saving's 'Anatomy of Drowning' training was also made accessible to staff in aquatic and service-based roles across all of the venues in addition to the regular staff development training undertaken throughout the year.

This year saw the continuation of the free culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) program for an additional 10 weeks. The CALD program, run in partnership with Royal Life Saving Society NSW, is a swimming initiative targeted towards adults in the multicultural community that reside in Blacktown who have never learnt to swim and those who are not confident in and around the water. The initiative includes one 30-minute lesson each week that focuses on water safety and survival skills.

The venues have also introduced image based, easy to understand signage that promotes lifejackets available for patrons to borrow free of charge during their visit. The lifejackets were introduced as an additional safety measure for weak or non-confident swimmers of all ages, allowing them to feel more comfortable using the pools while also reducing the potential for drowning. Signage includes written and visual indicators of how to correctly fit and wear the lifejackets to ensure patrons are getting the maximum benefit.



## Awards and commendations

Five staff members from Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope were honoured with Royal Life Saving NSW's highest honour at their Commendation Award ceremony this year. The award acknowledged members of the community for applying lifesaving skills in emergency situations.

Blacktown Key Venues was a finalist in Royal Life Saving Society Australia's inaugural awards gala, The Aquas, for Excellence in Drowning Prevention and Excellence in Diversity and Inclusion while Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope was a finalist in the Excellence in Aquatic Safety Design category. Key Venues won the Diversity and Inclusion category for the many initiatives introduced across all venues including the CALD and Swim Sense programs which are designed to keep the community safe while using the facilities.



- Aqua Learn To Swim moved to a continuous all year program, replacing the term to term program.

## Information

Aqua Learn to Swim is the swim school program run at four of Blacktown City Council's key aquatic and leisure centres. The program offers a variety of programs that cater to people of all swimming levels and abilities, ranging from as young as 6 months to adults. Our programs include:

- infant programs
- preschool programs
- school aged programs
- teen programs
- adult programs
- Aqua Swim Academy
- Acceler8 intensive school holiday program
- Swim Abilities lessons
- private lessons
- Swim Sense
- CALD swimming program (run with RLSSA)

As the first full year of lessons without the disruption of COVID-19 lockdowns or restrictions, centres saw an influx in the number of students needing lessons with classes and demand continuing to grow each term.

The Swim Sense initiative is a free four-day water safety program offered to adults living in Blacktown City. This program runs during the January school holidays and is designed to teach basic swimming and survival techniques to members of the community who have no or little experience in an aquatic environment. In 2023, 89 students across four of Blacktown Key Venues' aquatic and leisure centres participated in the program.

The culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) free adult swimming lesson program returned for its second term from July to September 2022. This initiative was designed and delivered in collaboration with Royal Life Saving NSW and ran across Blacktown Aquatic Centre, Blacktown Leisure Centre Stanhope and Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre Emerton. The program ran over a ten-week period with participants attending a 30-minute swimming lesson each week. Over the two terms that the program was offered, 100 adults were given the chance to learn vital water safety and swimming skills.

April 2023 saw the transition from a term-based program running in sync with school terms to a continuous all year program. The movement to a continuous program will be furthered by the introduction of a direct debit payment system starting in July 2023. This change was introduced in response to concerns about skill regression over holiday periods and to enhance customer experience, permitting for regular assessment and class progression.

Blacktown Aquatic Centre has been the central fitness and aquatic hub for Blacktown residents for over 60 years. The centre offers a range of high-quality facilities and services for all members of the community, including indoor and outdoor 50 metre pools, an outdoor toddler pool and splash pad and a fully equipped gym with a variety of dry and aqua group fitness classes on offer.



Riverstone Swimming Centre reached a major milestone on 23 December 2022, with the centre celebrating its 60th anniversary. The birthday was commemorated with Blacktown City Mayor Cr Tony Bleasdale OAM, Deputy Mayor Cr Julie Griffiths AM, Councillor Dr Moninder Singh and Councillor Bob Fitzgerald OAM on hand to lead the festivities. Cake, live music and a range of fun activities including face painting and a petting zoo helped to bring the community out in force for the anniversary party on 18 December 2022.

Riverstone Swimming Centre has established itself as a community favourite for leisure and fitness over the years, offering a range of services for patrons. This seasonal facility has given local residents access to a range of aquatic programs, including swimming lessons and aqua aerobic classes, that have brought great value to the community.

The Centre is the home base for Riverstone Dolphins Swimming Club. The Club holds a weekly training night and uses the centre for their championships, carnivals and presentations. In this season, Riverstone hosted 3,648 Dolphins during their meets and competitions.

Riverstone Swimming Centre has also remained popular with school groups from across western Sydney; running 20 school carnivals with 2,524 attendees. The Centre also welcomed over 6,000 students to the facilities through Department of Education and Training swim school lessons and individual school learn to swim and lifesaving programs.

# Riverstone Swimming Centre history

1938	Several drownings highlighted the need for a local safe swimming place. In 1938 a public pool for Riverstone was first proposed. Due to World War 2, plans were put on hold.
1950	In 1950 the Riverstone Civic Centre Co-operative was formed with the goal to raise funds to improve local facilities and build a swimming pool for Riverstone.
1951	On 15 October 1951 the co-operative held a public meeting to discuss an Olympic pool and other amenities in the area.
1957	Picking up the baton from the Riverstone Civic Centre Co-operative, Riverstone Swimming Pool Committee was formed on 1 May 1957. The committee's goal was to make 'learn to swim' opportunities accessible for every child in Riverstone and the surrounding suburbs. Fundraising was led by Norm and Shirley Wallace and Eric Martin.
1961	On 9 August 1961, the Blacktown Municipal Council joined the project and contributed funds for the construction of 2 pools and dressing sheds as well as a first aid room and kiosk.
1962	 <p>In early 1962, construction of the facility began. On 15 December 1962, Mayor Alderman Ashley Brown officially opened the 'Norman Wallace Pool' at Riverstone.</p> <p>The facility included 2 pools, a kiosk, a manager's office, a first aid room, dressing rooms, 3 showers and toilet facilities. The facility proved very popular from day 1 and on 23 December 1962 over 1,100 local residents enjoyed the water.</p> <p>Admission charges were just 1 shilling and 6 pence for adults, 6 pence for children and free for children under 5. The first pool manager, Mr Brooks, quickly established a swimming club and started offering learn to swim classes.</p>
1975	 <p>On 6 September 1975, a new Olympic pool, change rooms and a new kiosk area were added to the existing facilities.</p>
1992	 <p>In December 1992, works to extend the toddler's pool commence with a new wading pool to be added. It was to be more than 3 times the size of the original toddler's pool and would feature a landscaped beach area and sunshade, play equipment, barbecues, shade structures and seating.</p> <p>With the newly revamped facilities on the horizon the venue started to be known as the Riverstone Swimming Centre.</p>
1993	 <p>On 20 November 1993, Federal Member for Greenway, the honourable Russ Gorman MP officially opens the new facilities and the Centre become known as the Riverstone Swimming Centre. Keep Australia Beautiful recognise Riverstone Swimming Centre with an 'outstanding community facility' award.</p>
1994	The Riverstone Dolphins Swim Club is formed with 25 founder members.
2000	Pool covers are installed and windbreaks upgraded at the end of the Olympic pool to reduce the wind-chill and debris in the pool.
2017	Riverstone Swimming Centre hosts its first 'Dive-in movie' during the summer season with Zootopia.
2018	Riverstone Swimming Centre achieves a 5 star rating in the Royal Life Saving Australia, Aquatic Facility Safety Assessment.
2019	A venue identification pylon is installed on the corner of Garfield Road East and Piccadilly Street.
2020	Riverstone Swimming Centre becomes a NSW Government COVID Safe Venue and successfully navigates the COVID pandemic.
2022	 <p>Riverstone Swimming Centre celebrates its 60th birthday on Sunday 18 December 2022 with free entry and lots of fun activities for the community. 1,200 people join the celebration and are welcomed by Mayor Tony Bleasdale OAM, Deputy Mayor Julie Griffiths, Councillor Dr Moninder Singh and Councillor Bob Fitzgerald.</p>

# Looking forward: Blacktown Exercise Sports and Technology Hub

The Blacktown Exercise Sports and Technology Hub will open in November 2023. The hub will host facilities and expertise curated to enable the local community, along with national and international athletes, to benefit from environments and services designed to improve health and performance for individuals of all ages.

The BEST hub, through its shared spaces and partner organisations offers services that support Blacktown Council's aim of being a healthy, active and sporting city.

The hub will be partnering with the Australian Football League, Australian Catholic University, Delaware north, Sydney West Sports Medicine and WentWest.

Staff will be working with key stakeholders including Higher Education, the Western Sydney Local Health District, and sporting bodies to provide the local community with a facility and expertise that have a demonstrable benefit to health, fitness and sports performance.

The development also included The Lodge, a 37-room accommodation block designed to host visiting teams and athletes to the sports park as well as visiting friends, family and tourists in Western Sydney. The Lodge opened its doors on 12 October welcoming the first overnight guests to the sports park.
